Book Talks feature prominent authors from a variety of disciplines in a platform where they can present their latest publications and engage in discussions with a diverse audience.


## **Coffee Nights**




### Panel Discussions

Panel Discussions are aimed to address key spiritual and social issues by offering an academic platform. These discussions bring together scholars and experts with different perspectives on a certain topic.




#### A Baptist veteran talks about Islam



### "Charity" with UNA-NCA






### "Nonviolence" with Gandhi Institute

### "Human Fraternity" in World Interfaith Harmony Week





# **Community Events**

# Religious Literacy

Religious Literacy gatherings provide space for members of different religious communities where they can learn about each other's faiths and strengthen the sense of cohesion through cordial conversations

# **Scriptural Reasoning**

Scriptural Reasoning is a practice where Christians, Jews, and Muslims study each other's sacred texts. SR participants meet once a month to read short passages from their respective scriptures on a certain topic. Moderated by a study leader, each session is an opportunity to listen and share various perspectives. SR session thereby helps participants reflect on a curious list of topics within the Abrahamic tradition. The result is often a deeper understanding of others' and one's own scriptures, as well as the development of strong bonds across faith communities.
