Book Talks


Book Talks feature prominent authors from a variety of disciplines in a platform where they can present their latest publications and engage in discussions with a diverse audience.

Hearts and Minds: Hizmet Schools and Interethnic Relations



Between Thought and Action: An Intellectual Biography of Fethullah Gulen




Rumi Forum hosted an in-person book talk with **Dr. Ori Z. Soltes** on Fethullah Gulen's intellectual biography of thoughts, words, and actions including interviews with Hizmet movement followers. A brief discussion of his life and thought has been supplemented by the voices of more than 70 interviews conducted over several years, with individuals intimate and more distant but all inspired to be part of the process of serving humanity.



Book Talks

Profiles in Peace: Voices of Peacebuilders in the Midst of the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict



Rumi Forum hosted an in-person book talk with Rabbi Dr. Ron Kronish who traced the lives of Israeli Jews and Palestinian Arabs in Israel and Palestine who have dedicated their lives to building peaceful relations among the two peoples and between individual people who seek to live in peace and harmony with one another. These people have acted courageously and consistently in their work for peace.



Panel Discussions

Interfaith Bridges, Intrafaith Divides, and Polarization



Rumi Forum and the Braver Angels D.C. Project organized a special America's Public Forum event.

Discussants were **Rich Tafel**, Minister of the Church of the Holy City in downtown Washington, D.C., and **Ibrahim Anli**, Executive Director of Rumi Forum. **Luke Nathan Phillips** of Braver Angels hosted a conversation with them examining the ongoing divides in and between religious communities, the lasting common ground and prospects for new bridges among them, and the ways religious communities' navigation of these divisions might inform approaches to American polarization as a whole.



Interfaith Engagement

Community Events

Community Events is where we unite efforts with a large array of stakeholders. Together with our partners, we collaborate on occasions like iftars, concerts, and unity walks as opportunities for people of all walks of life to meet their neighbors in an interfaith context.

Religious Literacy

Religious Literacy gatherings provide space for members of different religious communities where they can learn about each other's faiths and strengthen the sense of cohesion through cordial conversations

Scriptural Reasoning

Scriptural Reasoning is a practice where Christians, Jews, and Muslims study each other's sacred texts. SR participants meet once a month to read short passages from their respective scriptures on a certain topic. Moderated by a study leader, each session is an opportunity to listen and share various perspectives. SR session thereby helps participants reflect on a curious list of topics within the Abrahamic tradition. The result is often a deeper understanding of others' and one's own scriptures, as well as the development of strong bonds across faith communities.

Rumi Forum organized a live Sufi music performance by "Sufi Melody" together with Rumi poetry by Dr. Sara Towe Horsfall.

Sufi Melody is a spiritual music ensemble that aims to establish a web of love and a sense of connectedness through music among cultural groups. Before joining the academia, **Dr. Sara Towe Horsfall** worked as a foreign correspondent and international journalist. She worked as a music teacher while completing her Ph.D. in Texas, and is currently a member of the Baltimore Classical Guitar Orchestra. She also teaches part-time at Frederick Community College in Frederick, Maryland, and is the organizer of the monthly Rumi Poetry Reading and Sharing group around the Baltimore region



Lox & Vodka and Tabla for Two: Klezmer sounds & Afghan/Indian beats



Rumi Forum organized a special evening crossing cultures, welcoming the Klezmer sounds of **Lox & Vodka** and the Afghani and Indian beats of **Tabla for Two**. Tabla for Two's motto of "playing for peace" was a good tagline for a show of healing music that lifted spirits and calmed souls, promoting understanding and connection through music.

Lox & Vodka's Klezmer music, which they define as Jewish soul music, has existed since the Middle Ages and is played for Jewish weddings and other celebrations. They also teach fun and simple Israeli folk dances, an incredibly memorable experience for everyone.

Tabla for Two plays traditional and classical music from Afghanistan and India, old Bollywood favorites, and Omari's original compositions blend classical Eastern beats with Western-style beats — a fusion of East and West mirrored in their partnership. They call it "New Music for the New World."

The Interreligious Communities Project (ICP) is designed to engage religious diversity within a safe and tested format and to widen participation in interreligious activity in Northern Virginia.

Participants will be invited to **listen**, **learn**, and **connect** through these visits to spaces where people **pray**, **worship**, **engage** in religious practices, and celebrate life's events. Each visit will contain specific elements: an architectural/religious **tour** of the space, an **introduction** to the religion, a communal **history**, **sharing** from members, a dialogue or a shared **activity**, and a delicious **meal**!

Each visit is more than a 'tour' or 'open house'; it is an experience. The ICP is designed to **deepen understanding** of one another to **build trust**, **generate goodwill**, and foster a greater **sense of community**.


Interfaith Leadership Forum
